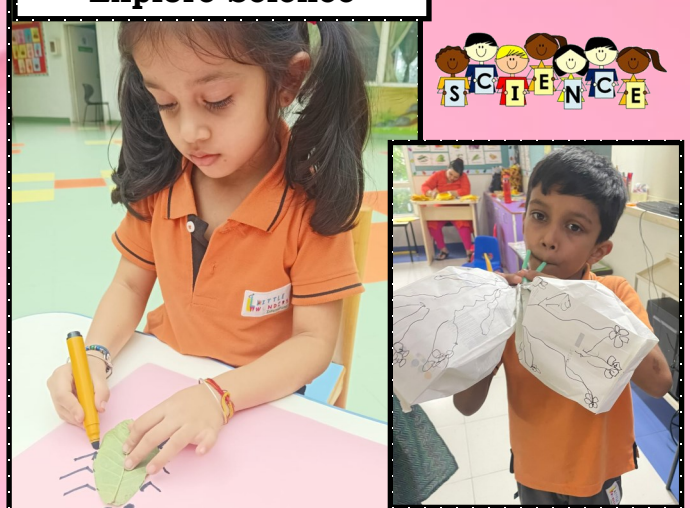


## Get Set Ready

WHIS had organized a Chess Competition in collaboration with the Rotary Club. In which almost 65 other school students participated.



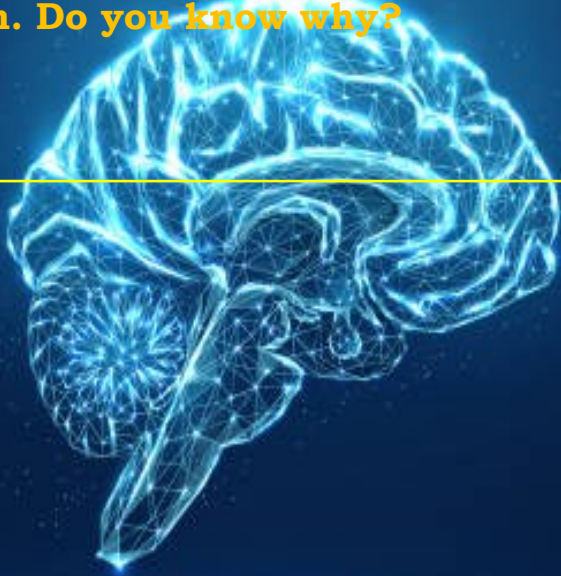
## Restaurant Visit

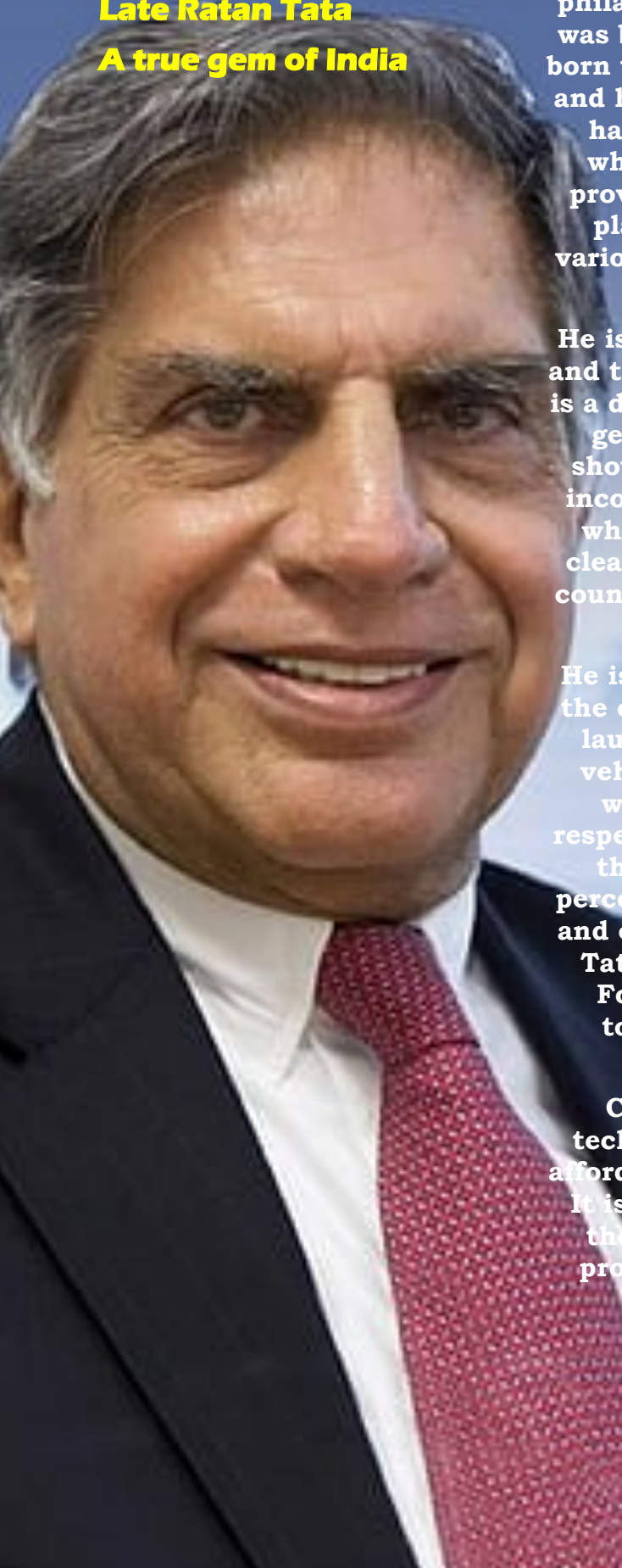

Ratan Tata has played a cardinal role in elevating Tata and its various subsidiary companies to new heights under his exceptional leadership skills.




