Independence Day



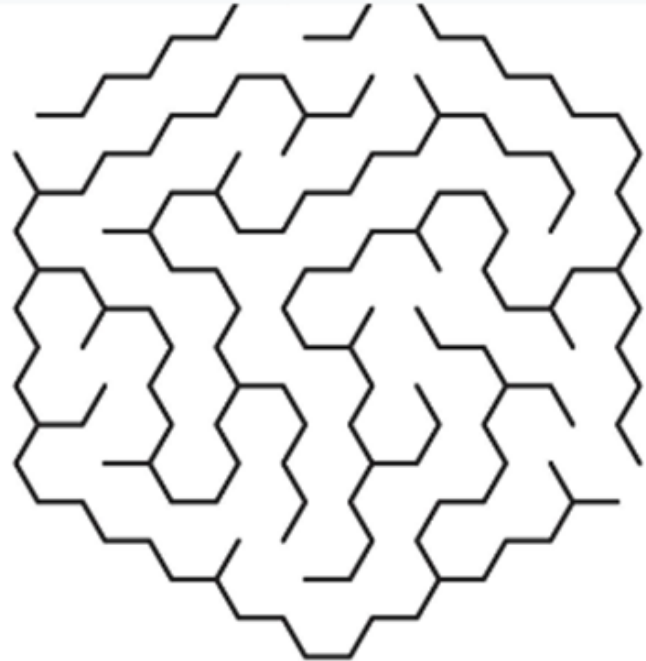

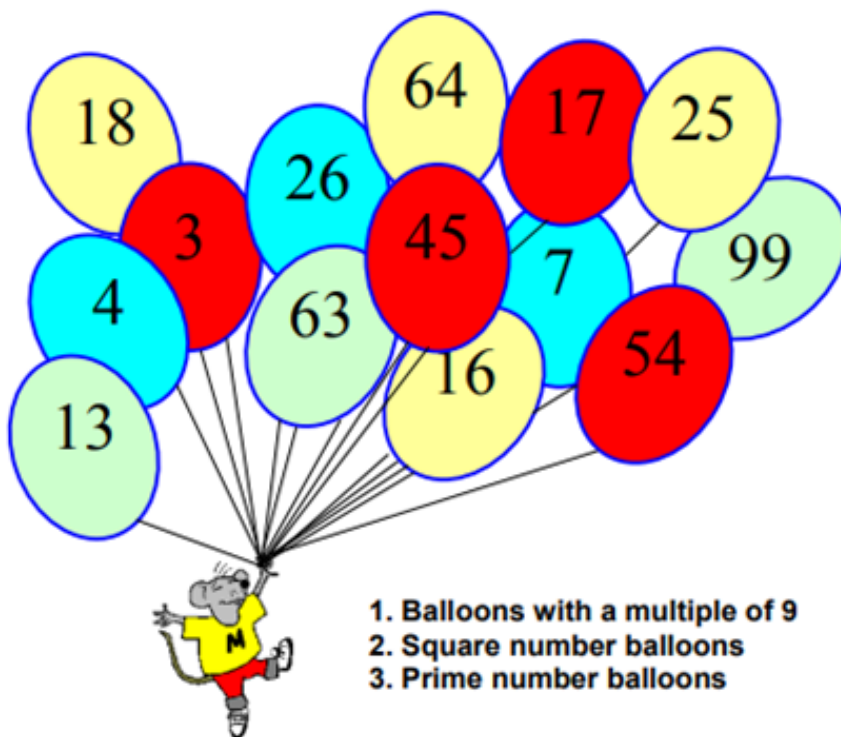

Health Advancements in Sports.

In recent years, countless pieces of technology have been changing the world's perspective on sports. From fan engagement all the way to analytics, it's safe to conclude that the sports world has changed for good.

Thanks to global research efforts and artificial intelligence companies, not only has the view of sports from a spectator's perspective changed, but so has the athlete's. Arguably, the most important piece of sports technology have been Heart Rate Monitors. These small, compact pieces of electrode are also life-saving. They consist of small pieces of plastic fixed into specific areas of the chest and abdomen. As the name suggests, this device helps in monitor the heart rate and other important information of an athlete while competing.

These have saved and improved many lives, the most important being of Danish football superstar Christian Eriksen. During a match against Finland on the 12th of June, 2021, Eriksen suffered an unexpected and sudden heart attack, which caused him to collapse on the field. Unfortunately, Eriksen was not wearing a heart monitor at this point. He was later given an ICD, a device which helped him speed up his return to football by 70% lesser than the average time!

Every ICD/ Heart Rate Monitor consists of two elements: a monitor/transmitter, which is worn on a chest strap, and a receiver. When a heartbeat is detected, a radio signal is transmitted, which the receiver uses to display/determine the current heart rate.

Fortunately, this type of technology has been promoted at a global standard by many of the top sporting leagues. Till today, researchers still work to make sports a more safer and enjoyable environment.

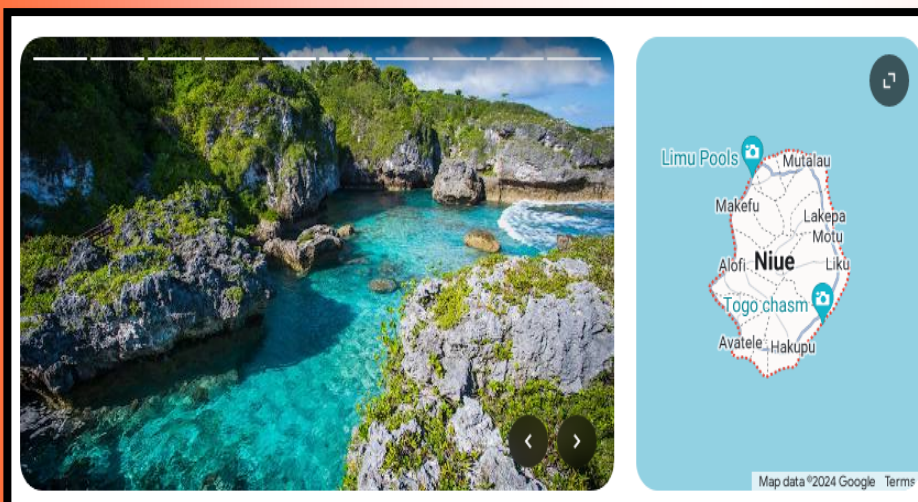
Niue: Heaven on Earth
